Established on 09/29/2020, the NGI Iris Service uses the iris biometric to provide the FBI and partner agencies a contactless capture capability, a national iris image repository, and a rapid search response with a high rate of accuracy.

- ☐ SIMILAR TO FINGERPRINTS; UNIQUE TO EACH INDIVIDUAL.
- ☐ FAST AND ACCURATE MEANS FOR IDENTIFICATION VALIDATION.
- USEFUL IN HIGH-VOLUME ENVIRONMENTS WHERE IDENTIFICATION IS CRITICAL.

RESPONSE

- ☐ Identity History Summary (i.e., rap sheet).
- Optional mug shot.
- □ National Crime

 Wanted Persons,
 National Sex
 Offender
 Registry, and
 Immigration
 Violator files.
